10. Sizes of the maps, scales, vertical contours

All maps are IOF standard, status: spring 2018

First Classics: size B4, 1:15000, contour interval 5m Second Classics: size A4, 1:15000, contour interval 5m Sprint: size A4, 1:5000, contour interval 2.5m Foxoring: size A3, 1:10000, contour interval 5m

11. Marking device

- We will use SPORTident system.
- Competitors can bring their own SI-cards.
- SI-card 8 will be provided for those who do not have SI-cards.
- The results evaluation software will be FjwW, provided by Karl Heinz Schade, DL7VDB.

12. Terrain characteristics, clothing and weather:

The terrains are located within 60 Km range from the event center. There are places with thorn, bushes and deep ravines. The Classics, Foxoring terrains are forest areas less than 150 meters above sea level and the Sprint terrain is a low forest less than 20 meters above sea level.

Competitors need to wear appropriate clothing. Trousers must be long no short pants. A pleasant and cool weather around 20°C degrees is expected, however be prepared for unexpected rain and cold temperature.
